The February and April classes are held at Maple Wood Nature Center.




Maple Syrup Events

Maple Wood Walks



Homeschool Winter Tree ID Walk Maple Wood Nature Center Tuesday, February 28 10:00 a.m. (45 min. walk)

We'll take a short walk on the trail and get hands-on experience identifying trees by their bark. We'll compare a Sugar Maple to other trees commonly found in a Beech-Maple habitat. We'll look at different sized Sugar Maples and discuss the number of taps appropriate for each size tree when tapping for sap. The walk is 100% outside, so dress in winter gear. The nature center will be open for warming and to explore. Please RSVP by Feb. 24, to the Park Office at 260-854-2225. All ages are welcome; best for children 1st grade and older.



Patchwork Trails Maple Wood Nature Center Walk Tuesday, April 18: 6:00 p.m.

This walk kicks off the 2023 Patchwork Trails walking schedule. These walks are offered in partnership between LaGrange County Parks and the LaGrange County Public Library. Join the Patchwork Trails Park Naturalist and Librarian for a lovely stroll through Maple Wood's spring wildflower show. The Naturalist will identify different flowers as we walk. Trails are crushed limestone and rated easy. We will walk approximately 1 mile in 1 hour.







Self-guided Wildflower Trail Maple Wood Nature Center April 12 - May 3

The Naturalist will mark blooming spring wildflowers along a designated trail. A brochure with identification information will be available to read while you walk. Please feel free to take pictures, but do not pick or cut the wildflowers. The early insects need them for food. The trail surface is crushed limestone and is ADA Accessible.

Great Backyard Bird Count Friday, February 17 9:30 - 11:30 a.m.

Maple Syrup Scavenger Hunt Saturday, March 11 2:00 - 4:00 p.m.

Participants will be given a list of clues to find 10 items connected to the process of making maple syrup. Look in the nature center or head down the trail through the sugar bush to complete the scavenger hunt. If you find/answer all 10, you will get a prize!

This scavenger hunt takes place both inside and outside, so dress for winter weather. This activity is fun for all ages. Come any time during the posted hours to participate.



Woodworking Workshop - Flowers! Thursday, May 4 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Dallas Lake Lodge

Join members from the Northeast Indiana Woodworkers to make an adorable wooden flower for Mother's Day or spring decoration. Minimum age for children is 8 years old. Children must be accompanied by an adult over 18. Each child will get to cut dowel rods, sand, drill holes, and paint their flower. For safety, please have long hair tied back, no baggy clothing, and wear clothes suitable for painting. Space is limited to 20 flower makers! RSVP to the Park Office by April 26, at 260-854-2225.
