### Growing Up WILD Virtual Training

For Preschool and Lower Elementary Teachers & Nature Educators

"Growing Up WILD is an early childhood education curriculum that builds on children's sense of wonder about nature and invites them to explore wildlife and the world around them. Through a wide range of activities and experiences, Growing Up WILD provides an early foundation for developing positive impressions about the natural world and lifelong social and academic skills." - The Association of Fish & Wildlife Agencies.

The first 20 who register may receive a FREE copy of the Growing Up WILD guidebook. The guidebook must be picked up in person between September 1– 22, at the LaGrange County Park Office, Dallas Lake Park, 0505 W 700 S, Wolcottville, IN, 46795. The free guidebooks are available thanks to funding from the generous support of the DNR/Division of Fish & Wildlife.

The guidebook may also be purchased online at Acorn Naturalists or www.fishwildlife.org/products.

Participants will be given "homework" activities to try at home with family or in the classroom prior to the virtual training. The "homework" must be completed and emailed/mailed to the Naturalist before the virtual training. The online evening will be spent together discussing the activities and adaptations, indoor vs. outdoor challenges and opportunities, and the benefits of kinder forest.

Certifications will be mailed out to participants, after the online meeting, who completed the "homework" and attended the online portion.
