





Summer 2022

Park Staff is pleased to announce several improvements to the Delt Church Disc Golf Course. We listened to community suggestions about the needs of the aging course, and have applied your feedback. Here is a list of new design elements and upgrades currently in the works:

- Relocating half of the holes
- Standardizing the appearance of the tees
- Upgrading course signs
- Placing marker flags above each basket for better navigation and identification
- Installing a shade sail at the location of the former Logan Field Pavilion
- Routing the beginning, middle point, and end of the course to the same location at the shade sail



The goal is to have all improvements complete mid-summer 2022. It is our hope the course revitalization will encourage new players and challenge veteran players. Park Staff would like to see the course become the location of future tournaments. We also hope people will discover the beauty and versatility of Delt Church Park while playing the course. Congrats to Chris Sluyter, of Park Maintenance, for being a great ambassador of this project.

Chain O' Lakes Count Tuesday, June 21 12:00 - 3:00 p.m.



East LaGrange County Count Saturday, July 23

Volunteers needed to help count butterflies! Participants can count butterflies at any time during the day. If you live inside the count circle, you can stay in your own backyard. If you live outside of the circle, the Naturalist has some suggestions of hot spots to count. Help us contribute to a national database of butterflies!

It is helpful to know some butterflies, but not necessary. Upon registration, you will be given a packet of butterfly ID pictures to help you. 
