Description of Hiking Trails

This looping trail system takes you through a variety of landscapes: forest, restored prairies, lakeside, marshland, and views of the fen. Trails are accessible, 5 foot wide, with compacted limestone fines and boardwalk surfaces.

1. Archery Trail (Orange)

1.73 miles

This trail offers approximately 30 3-D animal targets for archery with 2 shooting/ observation towers. This is also a beautiful trail to walk. The restored prairie savanna, forest, Meteer Lake, and marshland offer a variety of plants and wildlife to enjoy throughout the year.

2. Marsh Trail (Green)

.94 mile

A beautiful trail that is part of the Archery Trail. This is the shortest trail, great for a peaceful walk with limited time.

3. Trail (Lt Orange) alternate routes

4. Fen Trail (Blue)

1.9 miles

Seasonal views will include a variety of native wildflowers, birds, and butterflies. Wildlife is abundant. Fishing is allowed from the fishing pier on Duff Lake. Please enjoy this unique habitat, and the life it supports, by staying on designated trails.
