REGULAR SESSION

The LaGrange County Council met in Regular Session on Monday, December 14, 2020 at their meeting room, County Office Building, 114 W. Michigan Street, LaGrange, Indiana 46761, at 8:30 a.m., with the following present: Council Members, Charles F. Ashcraft, Jeffrey L. Brill, Peter A. Cook, Harold D. Gingerich, Steven E. McKowen, and Michael G. Strawser; and LaGrange County Auditor, Kathryn Hopper. Mr. Ryan J. Riegsecker was absent. Mr. Peter Cook brought the meeting to order and lead the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

AN ORDINANCE OF LIMITED DURATION ESTABLISHING STAY-HOME PAY FOR CERTAIN COUNTY EMPLOYEES
Mr. Peter Cook read the following Ordinance for consideration:

COUNTY OF LAGRANGE
ORDINANCE NO. 2020-12-14-A

AN ORDINANCE OF LIMITED DURATION ESTABLISHING STAY-HOME PAY FOR CERTAIN
COUNTY EMPLOYEES.

WHEREAS, the Governor of Indiana has declared a public health emergency regarding the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19”);

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of LaGrange (“Commissioners”) has declared a similar state of emergency for LaGrange County through December 31, 2020;

WHEREAS, the County Council, on behalf of LaGrange County, Indiana (“County”), desires to establish terms and conditions for County-related work performed at home;

WHEREAS, to combat the spread of COVID-19, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (“CDC”) has issued its Interim Guidance for Businesses and Employers (“Guidance”) (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/guidance-business-response.html>);

WHEREAS, the Guidance encourages sick employees to stay home;

WHEREAS, the Guidance recognizes that some employees may be responsible for caring for persons who have acquired COVID-19 and for children who are no longer in school;

WHEREAS, the Guidance encourages employers to allow employees to work from home as technology infrastructure and job responsibilities permit;

WHEREAS, the County Council has the authority under IC § 36-1-4-14 to establish a system of employment;

WHEREAS, the County Council, jointly with the Commissioners, adopted a Personnel Policies Handbook on December 16, 2019, as may be amended from time to time (“Handbook”);

WHEREAS, the County Council adopted County Ordinances 2020-10-13 (A) and 2020-10-13 (B) on October 13, 2020, as may be amended from time to time (“Salary Ordinance”), which promulgated employee wages and salaries for the year 2021;

WHEREAS, the County Council desires these rules to supplement the Handbook and Salary Ordinance, and where there is a conflict, to supersede both during the state of emergency;

WHEREAS, the County Council adopted County Ordinances 2020-03-30 C and 2020-11-09, in which stay-home pay was made available through December 31, 2020; *and*

WHEREAS, the County Council desires to renew the stay-home pay program through June 30, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF LAGRANGE, INDIANA THAT:

SECTION I – STAY-HOME PAY

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- A. In this section, “stay-home pay” means regular pay and benefits earned for employee work performed from home during the state of emergency, as directed by a supervisor.
- B. An employee who is directed by his or her supervisor to work from home shall receive stay-home pay for such work performed, subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. the employee is capable of performing the essential functions of his or her job;
 - 2. the employee is considered “on-call” and, therefore, must be available by phone if to respond to supervisors and other County officials and employees during the employee’s regularly scheduled work hours;
 - 3. the employee must be available to return to the workplace during the employee’s regularly scheduled work hours within two (2) hours’ notice from a supervisor; *and*
 - 4. the employee may not earn compensation for work from any other source during the employee’s regularly scheduled work hours.
- C. Each employee shall log the start and end times for all hours worked from home.
- D. No employee shall incur overtime hours for work at home without having first obtained approval from his or her supervisor to do so. The County cannot be held responsible for extra pay for any such hours worked without express prior supervisor approval.

SECTION II – MISCELLANEOUS

- A. References.
 - 1. Reference to another section of this ordinance or another law, document, fund, program, or public office, shall extend and apply to the same, as may be subsequently amended, elected, revised, recodified, renamed, or renumbered from time to time.
 - 2. Reference in this ordinance to a public servant, office, commission, committee, board, or fund, without reference to another jurisdiction, shall be construed as though it were preceded or followed, as appropriate, by the words “(of) LaGrange County (Indiana).”
 - 3. Should a provision of this ordinance require an act to be done which, by law, an agent or deputy as well may do as the principal, the requirement is satisfied by the performance of the act by an authorized agent or deputy.
- B. Conflicts. No part of this ordinance shall be interpreted to conflict with any local, state, or federal laws, and all reasonable efforts should be made to harmonize same.
- C. Severability. Should any section or part thereof of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any other portion thereof, and for this purpose the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.
- D. Effective Dates. This ordinance shall be considered effective upon adoption and expires at the end of the day on June 30, 2021.

Mr. Charles Ashcraft made a motion to approve the Ordinance. Mr. Mike Strawser seconded the motion and it carried unanimously. Mr. Mike Strawser made a motion to waive the requirement for second reading. Mr. Harold Gingerich seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

A JOINT ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REPEALING VARIOUS OTHER COUNTY ORDINANCES

Mr. Peter Cook read the following Joint Resolution for consideration:

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COUNTY OF LAGRANGE
JOINT ORDINANCE NO. 2020-12-14 B

A JOINT ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REPEALING VARIOUS OTHER COUNTY ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of County of LaGrange ("Commissioners") and the LaGrange County Council ("Council"), on behalf of LaGrange County, Indiana ("County") are preparing a code of ordinances;

WHEREAS, in preparation for a code of ordinances, the Commissioners and Council desire to amend and/or repeal various ordinances and resolutions that may no longer be desired, that may contain outdated references, that may conflict with current statutes, or for similar reasons;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners and Council desire to formally repeal some ordinances and resolutions that may have already been repealed, where the former repeal is only implied due to ambiguous language, restatement, and/or thorough coverage of the same subject matter by a later instrument;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code Section 36-1-4-11, the County may adopt ordinances and resolutions; *and*

WHEREAS, pursuant to *Corn v. City of Oakland City*, 415 N.E.2d 129, 131 (Ind. Ct. App. 1981), "it is well settled in Indiana Law that the power to enact ordinances has as a necessary incident thereto the power to repeal unless that power is restricted in the law conferring it."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF LAGRANGE, INDIANA, AND BY THE LAGRANGE COUNTY COUNCIL, JOINTLY, THAT:

SECTION I – NAME

This ordinance shall be known as the "LaGrange County 2020 Housekeeping Ordinance" or the "Housekeeping Ordinance" where the context is clear.

SECTION II – INTERPRETATION

- A. Whenever the following abbreviations are used in this ordinance, they shall have such meanings herein ascribed to them:
1. "Jt." means "Joint."
 2. "Ord." means "Ordinance."
 3. "Res." means "Resolution."
 4. "Sp." means "Special."
- B. An ordinance or resolution listed in *italics* is one that has been adopted by the County Council. An ordinance or resolution listed in underline has been adopted by both the Commissioners and the County Council. These indications are provided for reference only.

SECTION III – FORMAL REPEALS

Reference in this ordinance to a public servant, department, commission, committee, board, street, or fund, either generally or by title, without reference to another jurisdiction, shall be construed as though it were preceded or followed, as appropriate, by the words “(of) LaGrange County (Indiana).”
3. Should a provision of this ordinance require an act to be done which, by law, an agent or deputy as well may do as the principal, the requisition is satisfied by the performance of the act by an authorized agent or deputy.

B. Conflicts. No part of this ordinance shall be interpreted to conflict with any local, state, or federal laws, and all reasonable efforts should be made to harmonize same.

C. Severability. Should any section or part thereof of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole, or any other portion thereof, and for this purpose the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

D. Continuance.

1. The express or implied repeal or amendment by this ordinance of any other ordinance or part of any other ordinance does not affect any rights or liabilities accrued, penalties incurred, or procedures begun prior to the effective date of this ordinance. Those rights, liabilities, and proceedings are continued, and penalties shall be imposed and enforced under the repealed or amended ordinance as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

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- 2. To the extent the provisions contained in this ordinance substantially restate the provisions of a prior ordinance or resolution, such provisions shall not be deemed to be a new enactment of the old ordinances, but rather shall be deemed to be the continuation of the original provisions.
- E. Revival Prohibited. The express or implied repeal or amendment by this ordinance of any other ordinance or part of any other ordinance shall not be construed to revive any former ordinance, section, clause, or provision.
- F. Effective Date. This joint ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption by both boards.

Mr. Steven McKowen made a motion to approve the Joint Ordinance. Mr. Harold Gingerich seconded the motion and it carried unanimously. Mr. Mike Strawser made a motion to waive the requirement for second reading. Mr. Steven McKowen seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

SURVEYOR – DRAINAGE FUNDING

Mr. Zachary Holsinger, County Surveyor, explained that in various areas of the County there is storm water runoff. He needs funding in place to be able to complete these projects. The General Drain Improvement Fund would need approximately \$800,000 in additional money. In 2019 the Council committed \$50,000 a year out of Riverboat fund for the General Drain Improvement Fund for 4 years for a total of \$200,000. The Council discussed the need for an inventory of drains, a financial plan in place, and a list of priorities. The Drainage Board needs to be on board with the plan as well.

AMENDMENT TO THE SALARY ORDINANCE FOR 2021 – HIGHWAY ENGINEER

Mr. Ben Parish, Highway Supervisor, explained that he would like to proceed with the hiring of a County Engineer. He has funding available in the Motor Vehicle Highway budget to transfer into the salary line item. He is requesting an amendment to the salary ordinance as follows:

SHERIFF – PURCHASE OF RADIOS

Mr. Jeff Campos, County Sheriff explained that he would like to purchase portable radios in the amount of \$56,250 and mobile radios in the amount of \$42,500. He will approach the County Commissioners for approval of these items. He will need funding for \$42,500.

SHERIFF – 911 RADIO SYSTEM UPGRADE

Mrs. Tammy DeRemer, Communications Director, explained the need for a 911 Radio system upgrade. The current system is 20 years old. The cost of a new system is approximately \$400,000. The Sheriff has put this in his budget for 2021, but thought CARES Act money could be used.

Mr. Peter Cook read the following Resolution for consideration:

COUNTY OF LAGRANGE
RESOLUTION NO. 2002-12-14 C

A RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER UNENCUMBERED FUNDS TO THE "RAINY DAY FUND"
PURSUANT TO INDIANA CODE 36-1-8-5.1.

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 36-1-8-5.1 permits an Indiana county to establish a Rainy Day Fund to receive transfers of unused and unencumbered funds under said Indiana Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said statute, an Indiana County Council shall make a finding that the proposed use of the Rainy Day Funds is consistent with the intent of the fund before making an appropriation therefrom; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said statute, in any fiscal year an Indiana county may not transfer more than ten percent (10%) of its total budget for that fiscal year to the Rainy Day Fund; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said statute, the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance may not reduce the actual or maximum permissible levy of an Indiana county as a result of a balance in the Rainy Day Fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF LAGRANGE COUNTY, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

Therefore, effective this date, the LaGrange County Council approves the transfer of \$400,000 of unused and unencumbered funds from 2020 in the County General Fund to the "Rainy Day Fund".

The "Rainy Day Fund" shall be subject to the same appropriation process as other funds that receive tax money. The LaGrange County Council hereby intends to utilize its decision-making power regarding fiscal affairs and set priorities for all allocation and expenditure of the "Rainy Day Fund" as deemed necessary to best serve the residents of LaGrange County.






